UNIT 43 Passive (2) (present and past tenses)

These are the passive forms of the present and past tenses:

am/is/are + done/cleaned etc. Present simple Somebody cleans [this room] every day. Active: Passive: This room is cleaned every day. Many accidents are caused by dangerous driving. I'm not often invited to parties. How many people are injured in road accidents every day? was/were + done/cleaned etc. Past simple Somebody cleaned [this room] yesterday. Active: Passive: This room was cleaned yesterday. During the night we were all woken up by a loud explosion. When was that castle built? The house wasn't damaged in the storm but a tree was blown down. am/is/are being + done/cleaned etc. Somebody is cleaning [the room] at the moment. Active: Passive: The room is being cleaned at the moment. Look at those old houses! They are being knocked down. (shop assistant to customer) Are you being served, madam? was/were being + done/cleaned etc. Past continuous Somebody was cleaning [the room] when I arrived. Active: The room was being cleaned when I arrived. Suddenly I heard footsteps behind me. We were being followed. have/has been + done/cleaned etc. Present perfect The room looks nice. Somebody has cleaned it. Active: Passive: The room looks nice. It has been cleaned. Have you heard the news? The president has been shot. Have you ever been bitten by a dog? I'm not going to the party. I haven't been invited. had been + done/cleaned etc. Past perfect The room looked much better. Somebody had cleaned it. Active: Passive: The room looked much better. It had been cleaned. Jim didn't know about the change of plans. He hadn't been told.
